Did you have Polio

You could be experiencing the Late Effects of Polio, including Post-Polio Syndrome.

You're not alone! There are community groups in Victoria for us to gather, meet, get help and support each other.

What is LEoP?

The Late Effects of Polio (LEoP) is a broad term, and may or may not include a diagnosis of Post-Polio Syndrome (PPS).

Symptoms of LEoP include:

- Fatigue
- New or increasing muscle weakness and atrophy
- Muscle spasms/twitches
- Breathing and sleep problems
- Difficulty with speech and swallowing
- Chronic pain
- Increased sensitivity to cold and/or heat

If you are experiencing any issues related to polio/PPS/LEoP and requiring support, specialised health services are available through Polio Services Victoria, a post-polio service located in the Bolte Wing of St Vincent's Hospital, Nicholson St, Fitzroy.

Australian Polio Register

To truly understand how large the community of polio survivors is, and in order to advocate for your needs, we encourage all polio survivors to register their details - no matter where you got polio.



There could be as many as 400,000 polio survivors living in Australia, whether they contracted polio here or migrated after infection.

During the outbreaks from the 1930s up to the 60s, as many as 40,000 people contracted paralytic polio in Australia - and many more were infected with milder symptoms.

Post Polio Victoria

Post Polio Victoria (PPV) was established by polio survivors to advocate for Victorians with polio so that we can have access to the information and the services we need to live actively and independently.

We provide information on polio research, aids and equipment for health professionals and people with polio through our website and newsletters.
